The Southern Iowa Railway to be presented at Annual Meeting

Were you aware that Appanoose County was home to an electric railway system? On April 28, the Appanoose County Historical Society will revisit electric railway history during their annual meeting at 7:00 pm at the Centerville City Hall. After a brief business meeting and election of officers, the keynote speaker will be R. Wesley Bender, historian from the Midwest Electric Railway Association (MERA). Wesley will talk about the Southern Iowa Railway, which was located in Appanoose County. Railways were not usually located in less populated areas like Appanoose County, so it was a testament to the community leaders who made it come into being.

Wes has shared a bit of his biography with us: "Born in St. Louis and who's mother never drove, I was introduced to public transit early. Streetcars ran everywhere and I was mesmerized during my early years by these vehicles. Throughout my childhood I traveled by train back to the eastern seaboard to visit extended family. I was treated by riding public transit (streetcars) in many cities during those formative years and I now have a lifelong interest in electric railways.

I have been associated with the Midwest Old Threshers and the Trolley Line there since 1982. I have done extensive research on the fleet of cars at the MERA and the different Iowa electric railways that served this state. The MERA owes its existence to the employees there at the Southern Iowa Railroad and the rail fans that put the first Iowa electric railway museum together in Centerville back in 1954. 

Curators Corner

Time to spring into spring at the museum! The new Election Year Exhibit is starting to take shape. It features a three-stall voting booth, a ballot box from Franklin Township, plus several yard signs, buttons and photos. Also, it will feature the story of the most contentious election in Appanoose County History, held in 1925, when the KKK attempted to take over all of the city offices. The Lincoln League was formed to stand up to the opposition, and won, but by a narrow margin. Stop by and read about it!

We are still working on collecting stories and artifacts from the Continental Flight 11 crash of 1962. We have conducted an oral history event, interviewing Leo Craver, the first to report the crash; Bob Curtis, who was on the police force and spent a great deal of time at the scene, and Gary Barrickman, who was on the Sheriff's Posse, who helped at the scene. Bob Curtis has also donated two arm

rests and a piece of sheet metal from the fuselage of the downed airplane for the exhibit. We are still looking for still photos of the crash scene, or pieces from the crash site. If you have anything to share,

please call the museum at (641) 856-6040.

With help from a Community Fund Grant, we have received two new display units that will allow us to showcase two special collections. One unit will display our large collection of movie lobby cards and the other will showcase our large collection of Appanoose County postcards and photographs. These should be taking shape very soon!

Over the past few months, we have collected several new artifacts, including a large collection of cameras from Burrell Browns, a

GAR encampment medal from Abie Adams, several Cincinnati yearbooks from Randy Dwight, an old gas city street lamp from Leo Craver, a early Polaroid camera from Nelma Fuller, some large insulators from Kevin Kilpatrick, an APCO Block Coal Co sign from Leo Crow, a framed portrait of Governor Drake and a Bellair Rangers roll from Brad & Dewey McConville, some C.C. Stephenson prescription ephemera from Barb Halupnick, a large mine fan from Jay Phillips, and an advertising piece from the Majestic Theater from John & Marcia Holeman. Also, we have received a horse drawn road grader from Denise and Shaun Cassady, in honor of Donald Eddy and Leroy Cassady that is on display at the old jail on North Main.

We are continuing to collect pieces that cumulatively tell the story of Appanoose County, so if you would like to donate an artifact, please bring it by the museum!

2007 Haunted History Tour & Homecoming & The Wonderful Thing!

Fall was a busy season for the Historical Society! We held our best Haunted History Tour ever! Turnout was so large that we conducted two tours to keep the group size smaller. The night was fabulous and eerie with a full moon shining down on the cemetery. A couple of weeks later, we held our first annual Homecoming Open House, which was a resounding success! Many visitors to the area came to the museum while they were Skyler Jones family in town, and several more came to honor Bill Heusinkveld, for his contributions to local history with his many books. We were also thrilled to meet the family of Skylar



Jones, whose photo is featured in the museum, as well as in our 2007 historical calendar. He drove the Pure Ice Co. truck and his family had never seen the photo before! Our final event for the fall was the Grand Premier of the silent movie, "The Wonderful

Thing", starring Norma Talmadge. The outdoor scenes from the movie were filmed in Centerville and rural Plano, Iowa in 1921. There were two showings of the film and everyone enjoyed the rare opportunity to see a silent movie. Much of the film was shot on a stage in Hollywood, and the audience patiently awaited the moment when, at last, the subtitle popped up "Centerville, Iowa, USA", and the audience burst into cheers and applause! The Appanoose County Courthouse and the depot on the levee were shown, as well as the Harbold Farm in Plano. We were delighted that the descendants of the Harbold family had traveled to Centerville in order to see the movie! We plan on showing the film sometime each year, so watch for it!


