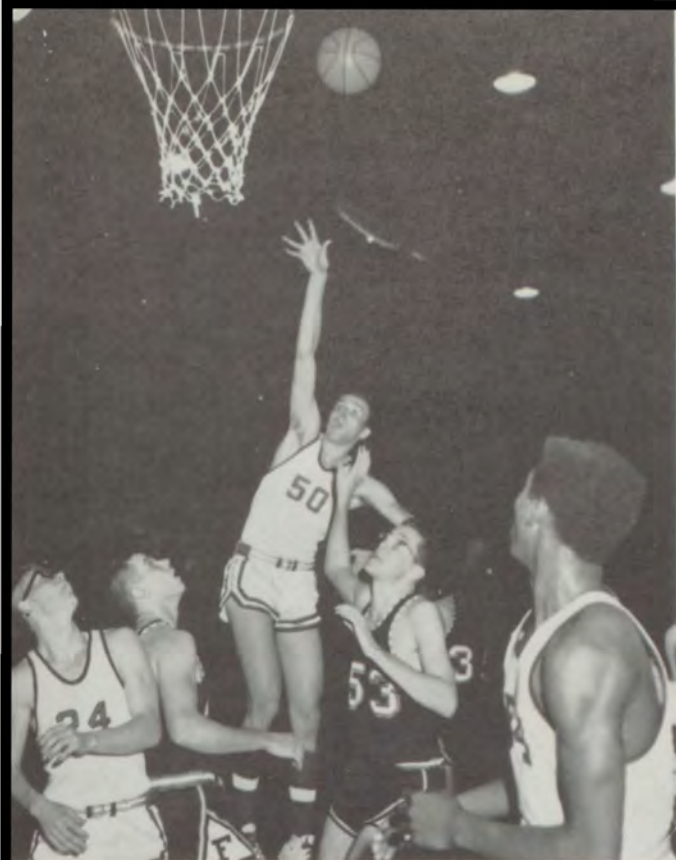

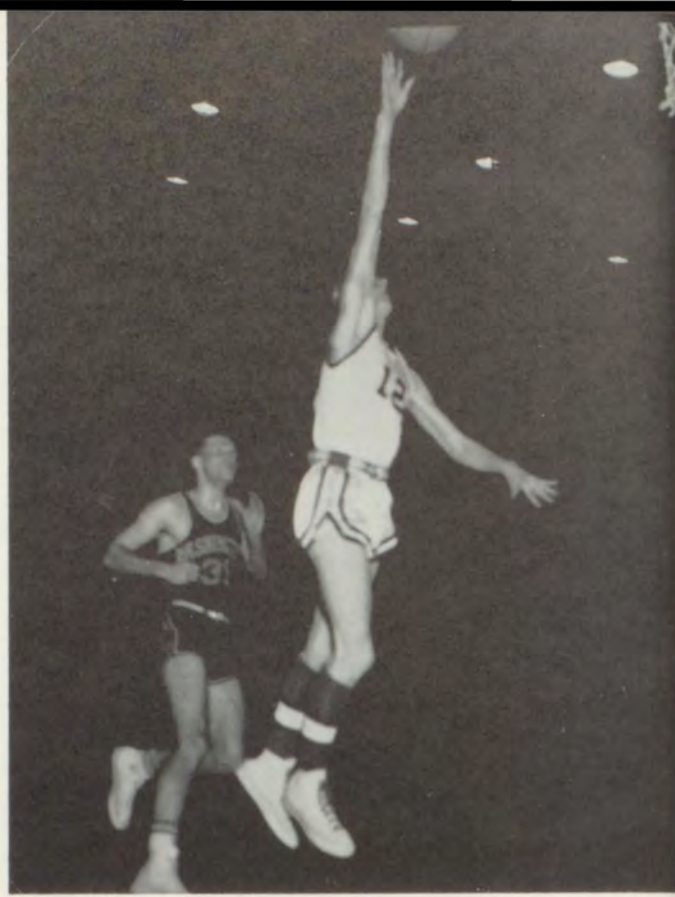

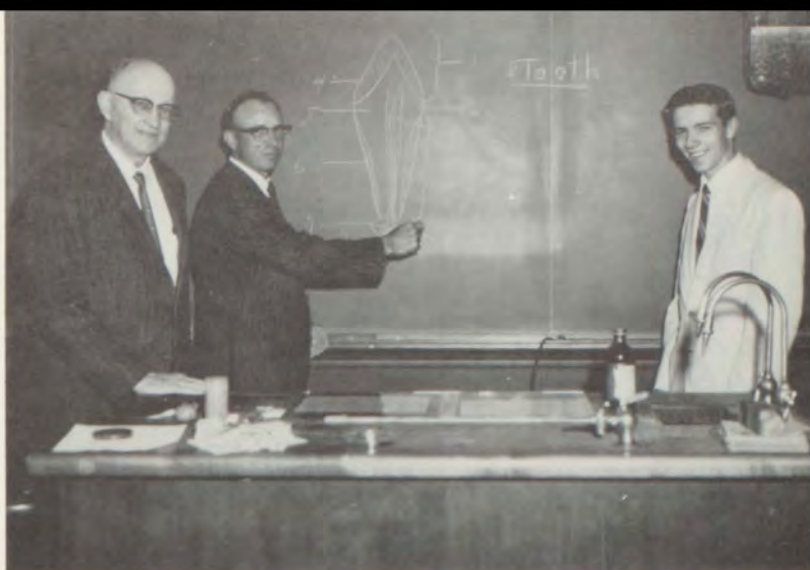


Science

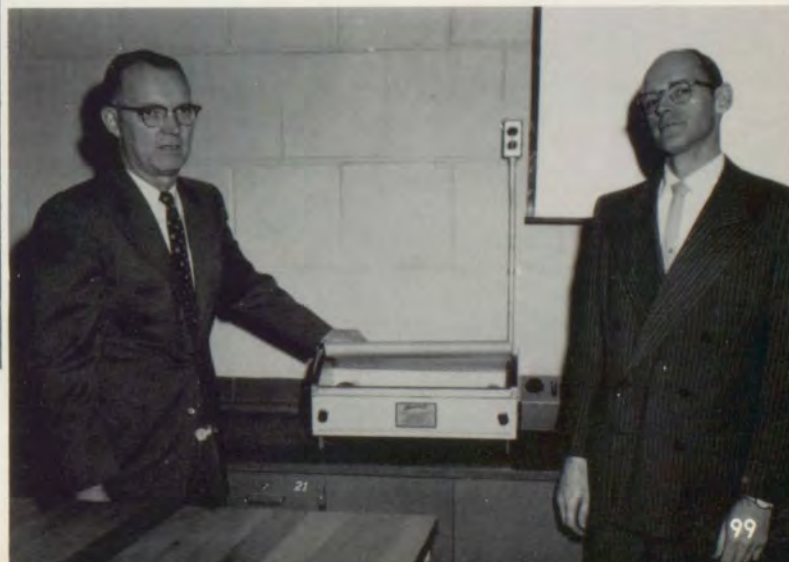
